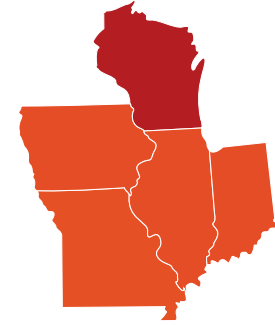


Supporting Wisconsin nonprofits through affordable, flexible financing for real estate and equipment needs.



IFF helps nonprofits serving low-income or special needs populations with below-market rate loans. IFF’s standard loan is a 15-year mortgage for up to \$1.5 million. Second position loans with local banks, leasehold mortgages, and loans as small as \$10,000 for equipment or facility repairs are also available.

Loan Features and Benefits

- Financing from \$10,000 to \$1.5 million per project
- Terms to 15 years
- Below-market rates, with no rate variance based on risk
- No points and no application, processing, or prepayment fees on most loan products
- Financing for up to 95% of total project costs (not appraised value)
- Financing for leasehold improvements
- Second position loans

Types of Financing

- Land or building acquisition
- Renovation and new construction
- Facility maintenance or repairs (leased or owned)
- Equipment, furnishings, service-oriented vehicles
- Affordable housing*

* Loan features and benefits for affordable housing loans may differ from those described above.
